Accounting 2.T	12,11	Recording Business Transactions	Students will learn how to record accounting transactions through using double entry accounting and the chart of accounts. They will also develop an understanding of accounting for GST and spreadsheet accounting.
Accounting 4.T	12	Analysis for Business Decisions	In this unit students will explore a number of trends in financial statement analysis including calculating and critically analysing financial ratios for decision-making.

Business 2.A	12,11	Human Resources and Business Management	Students explore the various aspects of Human Resources which includes skills for getting a job. Students also explore how to manage and lead people.

Business 4.A	12	Industrial Relations and Current Business Issues	Students explore the issues around Australia's industrial relations system which includes awards, wages, unions, penalty rates and employment issues. Students will also investigate current issues affecting business.

Economics 2.T	12,11	Macroeconomic Theory and Issues	This unit looks at how macroeconomic policy is used to achieve important economic and social goals that work towards long-term implications for prosperity, stability and the equity of the population.
Economics 4.T	12	Political and Research Economics	This unit examines the impact of Political institutions in Australia in determining Consumer Sovereignty and displaying rent-seeking behaviour with a comparison to a similar socio-political system (an Asian/Pacific system and one other.)
Geography.A	12,11	Global Transformations	This unit focuses on the process of international integration (globalisation) as a conceptual 'lens' through which to investigate issues in human geography. In doing so, it integrates the sub disciplines of economic and cultural geography, and political geography.
