Chinese Advanced 2.T	12,11	The World around us	Students will study Chinese through the topic of the 'The World Around Us'. This unit is for students who are proficient in the writing and speaking of Chinese Mandarin.
Chinese Advanced 4.T	12	The World around us	Students will study Chinese through the topic of the 'The World Around Us'. This unit is for students who are proficient in the writing and speaking of Chinese Mandarin.
Chinese Beginning.T	12,11	Society and Community	Students will study the following topics: daily life, eating and entertainment, health and going to the doctor as well how to describe people. Beginning Chinese is intended for students who have no previous knowledge of Chinese but students who have not completed Semester One Chinese should speak to the teacher before selecting this class.
Chinese Continuing.T	12,11	Society and Community	Students will study the following topics: Food, entertainment, media and technology. Continuing Chinese is intended for students who have completed two or more years study of Chinese at high school or students whose parents are native speakers but have no formal education in the language. Students who have not studied Chinese at Dickson College in Semester One should speak to the teacher before selecting this class.
ESL 2.T	12,11	Perspectives	Students will study ESL through the theme of Perspectives. They will be given the opportunity to explore a variety of texts through different media.
ESL 4.T	12	Exploring Literature and formal texts	Students will continue to develop their skills in writing and research. They will explore the language of report writing and analysis.
ESL 6.T	12	Analysing Literature	Students will extend their understanding of poetry by exploring different mediums such as film and drama
ESL .A	12,11	Consolidate Communication	Students will study the impact of media in society along with how language shapes perspectives.
ESL Tutorial	12,11	Language Tutorial	A support class for ESL students
French Beginning 2.T	12,11	Society and community	Students will study Tourism and Urban Living with Cultural Perspectives. they will study language associated with being a tourist and also learn about French colonialism.
French Beginning 4.T	12	Life style and traditions	Students will study Popular Culture and the Arts. eg, films, music, the cuisines, and the cultural traditions of the Francophone world.
French Continuing.T	12,11	Society and community	Students will study Tourism and Urban Living with Cultural Perspectives. they will study language associated with being a tourist and also learn about French colonialism.
Indonesian Advanced.T	12,11	Society and Community	Advanced Indonesian Students will focus on Travel (tourism/consumerism) and Health (traditional/modern medicines/ lifestyles)
Indonesian Beginning.T	12,11	Society and Community	Beginning Indonesian Students will focus on Travel (eating out, bargaining) and Health (going to the doctor, sports/activities)
Indonesian Continuing.T	12,11	Society and Community	Continuing Indonesian Students will focus on Travel (touring Indonesia) and Health (Issues and wellbeing)
Japanese Beginning 2.T	12,11	Life Style and Traditions	This is the second of four courses in a Beginning Japanese minor or major. Students will study about family, school, locations in the neighbourhood, directions, housing, and also the katakana script and some basic kanji. The prerequisite for this course is Beginning Japanese 1.
Japanese Beginning 4.T	12	The World around us	This is the fourth of four courses in a Beginning Japanese major. Students will study about purchasing goods and services, travel around Japan and local outings, Japanese cuisine and restaurant etiquette, discuss future plans beyond school and discuss weather, travel and Japanese geography and famous locations. The prerequisites for this course are Beginning Japanese 1, 2 and 3.
Japanese Continuing.T	12,11	The World around us	This is the second of four courses in a Continuing Japanese minor or major. The prerequisite for this course is Continuing Japanese 1 (or continuing Japanese 3 for year 12 students.) Students will study about social and environmental issues and discuss future plans, goals, careers and ideal future prospects.
Latin 2.T	12,11	The Tragedy of Dido, Queen of Carthage	This course in Beginning Latin uses material based on the life-story of the famous Roman poet Horace, who lived during the time of Julius Caesar, the most exciting period in Roman history. Students learn to read Latin text, simple at first, but expanding in content.

Latin 4.T	12	Murder in the Forum	The course is very helpful for their knowledge and understanding of English vocabulary and grammar, work in other languages, the understanding of Roman history and the encouragement of clear thinking. The course is also a sound basis for students wishing to study Latin at tertiary level.
RBP IT	12,11	Digital media	Students will operate a Digital Media package to produce industry standard documents and web formats and use social media tools for collaboration and engagement according to workplace protocols. They will capture a digital image for use in documents and digital applications and then produce and prepare photo images for documents and digital applications. The students will also consolidate Workplace Health and Safety skills along with the operation of software packages.
RBP Literacy for work.A	12,11	Literacy for Work	Students will study literacy and language content related to the study of work and post school skills.
